

ETNO DELOVNA SKUPINA CIDOCA

Predlog o ustanovitvi nove delovne skupine v okviru Mednarodnega komiteja za dokumentacijo (ICOM - CIDOC) je bil podan na prvi konferenci evropskih etnoloških muzejev, ki je bila februarja 1993 v Parizu, Cidocova konferenca v Ljubljani pa je bila predlagana kot mesto, kjer naj bi se ta skupina oblikovala.

Srečanje v Ljubljani je pokazalo, da obstaja potreba po ustanovitvi delovne skupine, ki bi reševala probleme s področja etnološke dokumentacije. Prvega srečanja delovne skupine se je udeležilo 13 članov Cidoca iz 10 držav Evrope in Amerike. Z ustanovitvijo ETNO DELOVNE SKUPINE so bile sprejete delovne naloge v prvi fazi:

- izdelava osnovnih etnoloških podatkovnih standardov, ki bi omogočili kontrolo nad predmeti, ki so del etnološke kulturne dediščine
- aplikacija in razvoj etnoloških podatkovnih standardov na različnih nivojih od regionalnih, nacionalnih do mednarodnih, kar bi omogočalo in pospeševalo komunikacijo med različnimi institucijami odgovornimi za varovanje etnološke kulturne dediščine
- pomoč državam pri razvoju podatkovnih standardov

Načrti za delo :

1993 - 1994 Priprava vprašalnika s pomočjo katerega bi dobili informacije o zbirkah, ki jih hranijo muzeji in načinu dokumentiranja predmetov. Vprašalnik bo poslan etnološkim muzejem v Evropi, Kanadi in Ameriki

1994 - 1995 Rezultati vprašalnika bodo osnova za pripravo minimuma etnoloških standardov in bodo predstavljeni na naslednji Icomovi konferenci v Stavangerju leta 1995

CIDOC ETHNO WORKING GROUP

The proposal on the establishment of a new Ethno Working Group within the International Documentation Committee (ICOM - CIDOC) was presented at the European Conference of Ethnological and Social History Museums in February 1993 in Paris and

adopted at the 1993 CIDOC conference in Ljubljana.

The need for establishing such a Working Group dealing with the ethnological documentation problems was confirmed at the founding meeting of an Ethno Working Group which was held at the time of the CIDOC conference in Ljubljana, and attended by 13 CIDOC members from 10 different countries (Europe and USA).

With the establishment of the new Ethno WG, the future goals and a draft working plan were laid down:

1. Setting and developing basic ethnological data standards which would lead to the control of series of objects that are part of the ethnological cultural heritage.
2. Application of the advanced ethnological data standards on different levels from regional, national to international level in order to facilitate and promote the communication between different bodies, and also to gain control over the cultural heritage.
3. Assist countries in developing data standards.

Working plan:

1993 - 1994 Preparation of a special questionnaire. This questionnaire would provide adequate information about the types of objects stored in museums and how they are documented. It would be distributed to all ethnological museums in Europe, Canada (with the help of CHIN) and USA (with the help of Smithsonian Institution).

1994 - 1995 On the basis of the results of the questionnaire the basic ethnological data standards will be elaborated and presented at the next ICOM conference in 1995.
